Timing of Events

We will start the program earlier on Saturday as we have the campfire ring earlier in the day this year due to other reservations. Please see the schedule of events below for details.

Health Forms

All campers (including adults and siblings) MUST provide a completed BSA health form, sections A&B prior to camping. This is a strict BSA rule that is governed and inspected by the camp facility, required by BSA and enforced by Pack 1491. You can find the health form on the pack 1491 website at www.pack1491.org. Friday Night Camping

Friday night camping **will be permitted this time**. We will have the required number of BALOO (Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation) trained leaders available on Friday night to permit Friday camping per the BSA rules and regulations.

Dining

Families are to provide their own meals. The Pack will not provide any of the meals at this event. Please plan accordingly and bring adequate food and drinks for your family for the duration of the campout.

‘*’ Families are permitted to stay on the property the entire day, but the campsites must be broken down and all gear must be out of the campsites by 11:45.

Lake Activities

There is a lake on the reservation and very close to our campsites. However, all kids are restricted from the lake unless under the direct supervision of an adult. No exceptions! People have inquired as to the need for a fishing license. Since we are on a private Scout Reservation, fishing licenses are NOT required.

What Gear to Bring

- Refer to the Packing List on the web site (pack1491.org under the Resources tab – Camping Stuff – What do I Bring Camping) for suggestions.

- Bring an extra change for clothes for your children if you think they will want to participate in “sponge wars”.
- Fishing Rods if you enjoy fishing.

What Not to Bring

- No electronics of any type are allowed for the children. Adults are encouraged to make calls and process correspondence away from camp.
- No alcohol is permitted on any BSA property at any time.
- Smoking is not permitted in front of the boys at any time.

Camping is a big part of scouting and fun for the entire family. Come out to Woodruff and enjoy the camaraderie and the great outdoors.
